A New England Food Vision – Considerations for building capacity to produce at least 50 percent of the region’s food by 2060



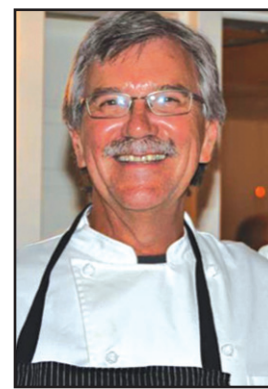

In 2011, along with several other co-authors including MOFGA's previous executive director, Russell Libby, Amanda Beal was part of a team of researchers and food system experts that began to explore in depth the capacity for New England to produce a much higher percentage of its food than it currently does. Over the next few years, “A New England Food Vision: Healthy Food for All, Sustainable Farming and Fishing, Thriving Communities” was developed and published by Food Solutions New England. This vision is a collaborative report, based on extensive research and designed with broad public input, that considers the future of our region: a future in which food nourishes a social, economic and environmental landscape that supports a high quality of life for everyone, including generations to come. Such an aspirational vision has attracted great interest and support from farmers, fishermen, policymakers, academics and many others. Yet as the path toward achieving this vision emerges, it remains largely to be built, and Maine plays an especially important role in the potential to produce 50 percent of the region’s food by 2060. Beal will give an overview of “A New England Food Vision” and describe how it is being used by numerous individuals and organizations. She will tell what needs to be done to achieve the goal of producing at least 50 percent of the region’s food by 2060.

Featured Speakers

Sam Hayward

Maine is justly famous for the diversity and quality of its organic agriculture and for its iconic blueberries, apples, lobsters and a handful of popular seafood species. Our state has also seen strong growth in interest in foraged foods of woods and fields. From the waters and shores of the Gulf of Maine, innovative fishers are bringing to market seafood species that are less familiar to cooks and diners than are favorites such as haddock and scallops, and chefs and others are finding exciting ways to introduce these species to their customers. This demonstration will focus on a market-basket of fresh, seasonal seafoods, their natural history, uses and cooking methods – including examples of Maine-grown and wild-harvested seaweeds, a food source that has grown exponentially along the Maine coast. Sam Hayward, founding chef and co-owner of Fore Street in Portland's Old Port, formerly was chef-owner of 22 Lincoln in Brunswick and chef at the Harraseek Inn in Freeport. The Fore Street team recently opened its new seafood-centered restaurant, Scales, on Maine Wharf. A James Beard award winner and former MOFGA board member, Hayward's career has spanned four decades of cooking from Maine's agricultural and marine bounty. He lives with his wife, Jan, in Bowdoinham.

Stuart Kestenbaum is the author of four collections of poems, “Pilgrimage” (Coyote Love Press), “House of Thanksgiving,” “Prayers and Run-on Sentences” and “Only Now” (all Deerbrook Editions), and a collection of essays, “The View From Here” (Brynmorgen Press). The director of Haystack Mountain School of Crafts from 1988 until 2015, he has written and spoken widely on craft making and creativity, and his poems and writing have appeared in numerous small press publications and magazines, including Tikkun, The Sun, the Beloit Poetry Journal, and on Garrison Keillor's Writer's Almanac. In 2016 he was appointed Maine's poet laureate.
