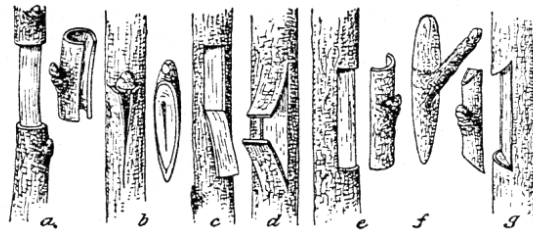
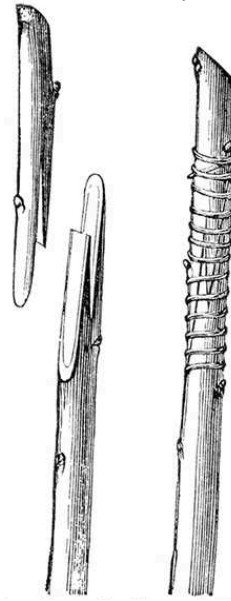


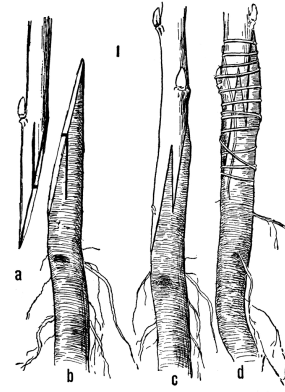
FIG. 200—UNCOMMON METHODS OF BUDDING

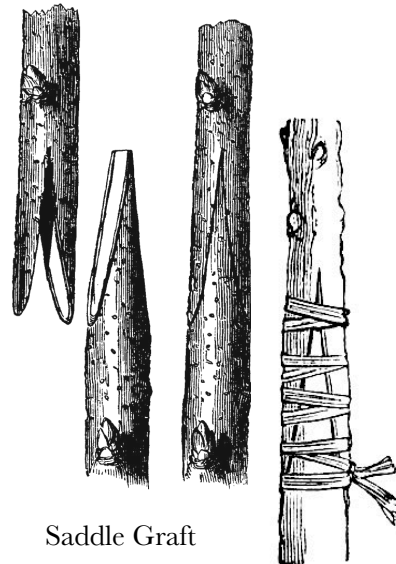

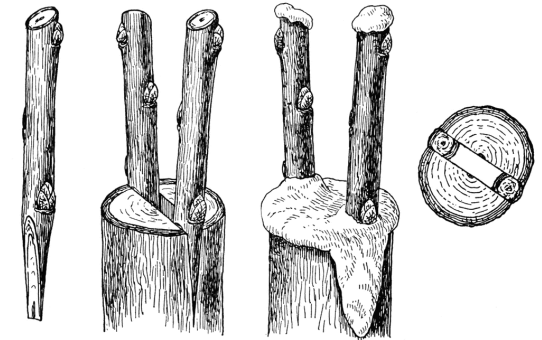

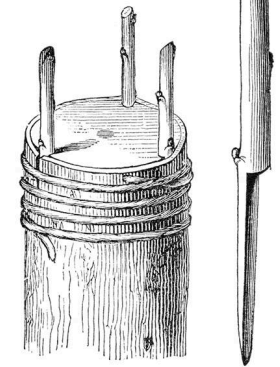

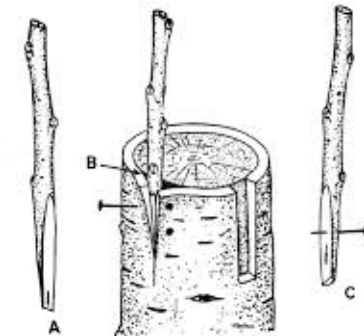

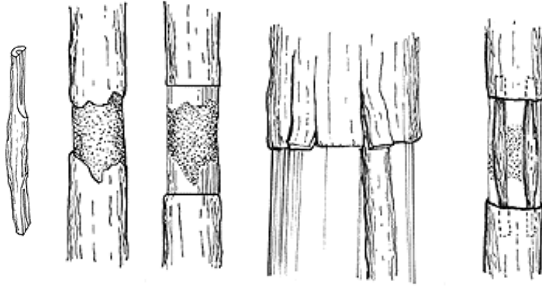

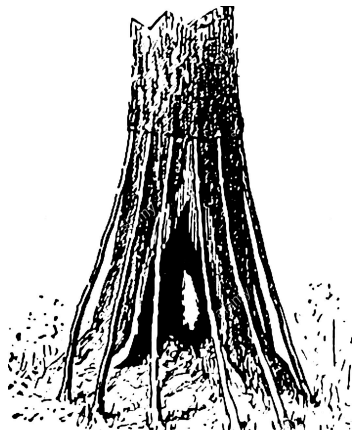

Bridge Grafting

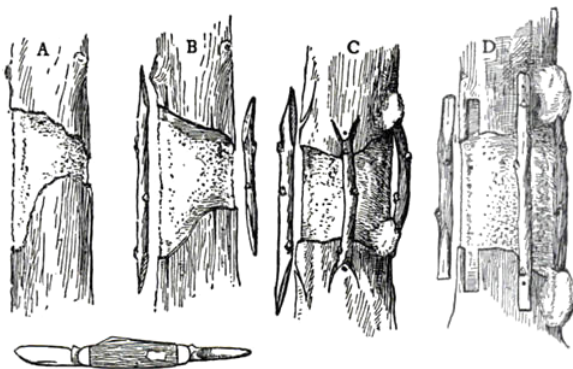
(early in growing season)



used to repair a damaged trunk or branch



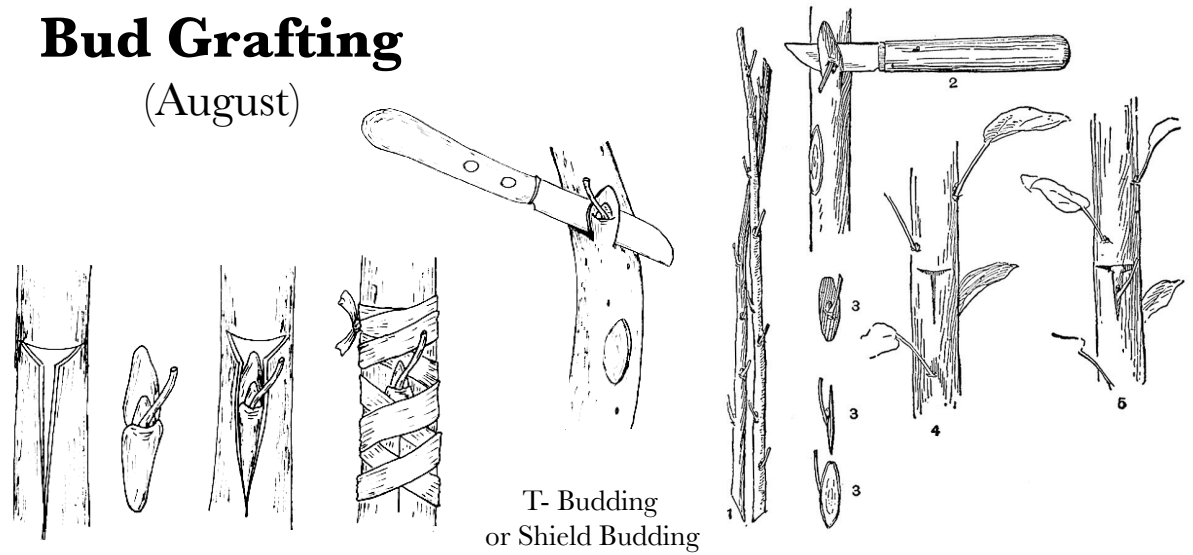
you can use a root sprout



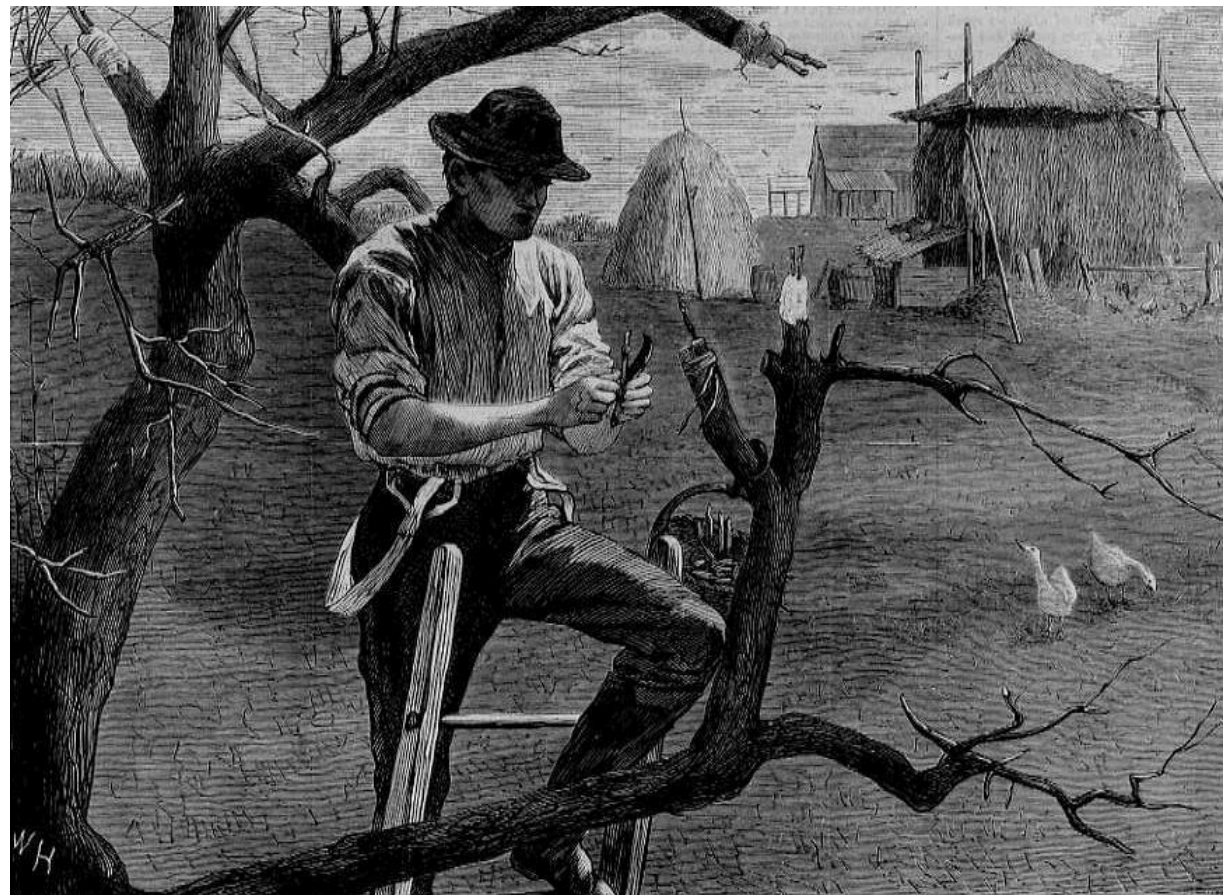
or dormant scionwood cut from waterspouts
