

IMPACT REPORT

The Maine Organic Farmers and Gardeners Association (MOFGA), formed in 1971, is the oldest and largest state organic organization in the country. MOFGA is a broad-based community that educates about and advocates for organic agriculture, illuminating its interdependence with a healthy environment, local food production, and thriving communities. Through education, training and advocacy MOFGA is creating a food system that is healthy and fair for all of us.

2023 impact, by the numbers:

58,650

FARMER PROGRAMS

- **1,158** participants in farmer programs events.
- **109** farm visits and consultations.
- **397** farmers have started their business through the Journeyperson Program.
- **\$75,082** in grants distributed to support **16** farms making soil health improvements.



MOFGA CERTIFICATION SERVICES

- 58,650 certified organic acres of land.
- **526** certified organic producers.
- **14** Certified Clean Cannabis operations.
- **\$122 million** in gross sales by certified operations in 2022.

COMMUNITY EDUCATION

- **2,500+** participants in gardening, orcharding, and forestry events, including tours and service learning opportunities on MOFGA's campus.
- 600 people attended the 40th annual Seed Swap and Scion Exchange, sharing and exchanging free resources for gardeners and growers.
- **14** new trees and shrubs planted in MOFGA's forest as part of the new climate adapted tree planting demonstration.





Did you know ...

In 2023, MOFGA and MOFGA Certification Services (MCS) were chosen as a core partner and the state lead for Maine through USDA's Transition to Organic Partnership Program (TOPP). TOPP is one of three focus areas by USDA to transition more agriculture to organic (generally known as the Organic Transition Initiative), as part of their larger climate-smart goals.



COMMON GROUND COUNTRY FAIR

- **64,162** fairgoers, making it the third largest Fair in MOFGA's history.
- **600+** educational events.
- **50** food vendors, **17** of them new this year.
- 2,447 volunteers filling 4,894 shifts.

PUBLIC POLICY

- Provided testimony on more than **60** bills at the state legislature.
- Advocated for many important measures in the 2023 Farm Bill, including **8** priority marker bills.
- Celebrated **2** organic land-care ordinances passed in Maine towns, Hallowell and Cape Elizabeth.

- **\$1,641,535** raised through **13,693** donations.
- **\$1,425,448** raised through grants.
- **9,561** MOFGA member households.

- 25,598 volunteer hours committed to MOFGA's programs, equivalent to a donated value of \$814,016*.
- **5,505** volunteer shifts.
- **1** barn entirely rebuilt in time for the Fair after the January campus fire.
